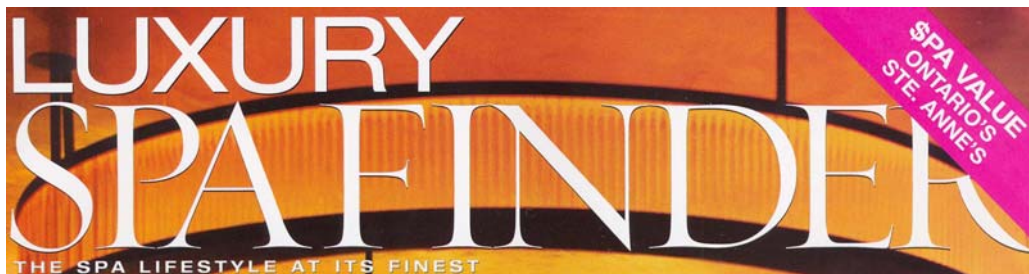

ROOM FOR TWO | DOMINICAN REPUBLIC



PuntaCana Resort & Club, Dominican Republic

WHILE MOST CARIBBEAN COUPLE'S SUITES ARE SUN-KISSED AND SEA-BREEZY, THIS ONE, AT THE RESORT'S NEW SIX SENSES Spa, takes the opposite tack: It's a cool, cave-like cocoon. The walls framed by the arches are made of rough limestone, while the floor and elevated soaking tub—the suite's most beguiling amenity—are fashioned from local coral stone. (The 400-square-foot suite also holds a steam shower, sauna, dressing area, and daybed.) It takes a detour from the Dominican Republic, though, with the artwork. In the alcoves flanking the bathtub are teak carvings imported from Thailand (Six Senses' home base), proof that the language of spa is an increasingly international one. —ANN ABEL

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
