The line between indoors and outdoors blurs at this luxurious seaside gem

he Tortuga Bay experience begins at the Dominican Republic's Punta Cana International Airport, where visitors are personally whisked through customs and driven to the resort enclave just a few miles away. The short trip from airport to resort is intended to be seamless for the guest, and once on property, the theme of seamlessness extends to the architecture and design as well.

Designed entirely by Oscar de la Renta, the ultra-exclusive Tortuga Bay is a nod to the simple serenity of its surroundings. Opened in December 2005, the resort is nestled into the Puntacana Resort & Club along the eastern shore of the Dominican Republic. Tortuga Bay's 15 beachfront villas, restaurant, pool, walkways, bars and public spaces merge seamlessly into their quiet Caribbean surroundings—and that's no accident, according to de la Renta.

The noted designer has called his vision for Tortuga Bay one of "unrestricted simplicity" that complements the beauty of the environment, and doesn't interfere with it.

The villas take center stage at Tortuga Bay. All of the one- to four-bedroom configurations feature not only a color

Warm saffron shades characterize the villa exteriors and bedroom interiors, while white trim provides a simple framework for the blue skies outside.
